



Schedule of Tuition and Fees

2027-2028 School Year

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

This Schedule forms part of the Enrollment Agreement for 2027-2028. It summarizes tuition, included services, required and variable charges, payment options, and refund provisions.

I. Application and Enrollment Charges

Application Fee: EUR 150 Payable upon application and before an admission decision is made. Non-refundable.

Capital Levy: EUR 2,500 A one-time contribution toward campus and facilities improvements. Charged once per family while siblings are simultaneously enrolled. If a student leaves and re-enrolls within 24 months, it is not charged again. Non-refundable.

II. Tuition Rates

Full boarding includes accommodation and meals seven days per week during the school year, except published vacation periods. Five-day boarding includes accommodation and meals Monday through Friday, except published vacation periods. Day-student tuition includes instruction, breakfast and lunch on regular school days, and the standard academic program.

III. List of Items Included in Tuition

- ☒ Two scheduled, multi-day excursions to destinations throughout Europe.
- ☒ Five scheduled ski or snowboard trips for full-boarding students.
- ☒ Accident insurance coverage during all school instruction and events both on and off campus.
- ☒ Campus wifi, school email, computer lab access, and standard educational technology.
- ☒ Regular academic reports, transcripts and other documentation or confirmation for all families.
- ☒ Breakfast and lunch on weekdays for all day students.
- ☒ Accommodation, meals, residential supervision, support and guidance according to boarding status.
- ☒ Wide variety of weekend activities for full-boarding students including overnight trips, sports events and other activities (12-15 per weekend).
- ☒ Course-specific outings and curricular excursions.
- ☒ School-wide celebrations and awards events.
- ☒ Transfers to/from Salzburg Airport or Hauptbahnhof on published arrival/departure dates and immediately before and after published vacations.

IV. Required and Variable Charges

Item	Amount	Notes
Physical Education Uniform	Approximately EUR 100	Required for newly enrolled students and thereafter only when replacement is needed.
Public Transportation Pass	Actual cost (300-400 EUR)	Required for boarding students when necessary for participation in the school program.
Student Incidentals Deposit	EUR 2,000	Required for full-boarding and five-day boarding students. Held on account; not a fee.

The Incidentals Deposit may be used for personal or individually incurred expenses. Families receive account statements and may be asked to replenish the balance. Any unused balance is refunded or carried forward after outstanding charges have been settled. Charges that may be applied at cost include: AP and other external examination fees; individual music lessons; tutorials outside the standard academic program; winter-sports equipment rental; optional or at-cost weekend activities; additional weekend accommodation for five-day boarders; medical costs not covered by insurance; transfers to/from Munich, Vienna, or other airports; visa/residence-permit expenses; property damage; and other parent-authorized personal expenses.

V. Health Insurance and Residence Requirements

Students whose nationality or residence status requires Austrian health insurance, residence authorization, or other governmental documentation must maintain all legally required coverage and documentation. AIS-Salzburg may assist with administrative procedures; insurance premiums, governmental fees, visa costs, and other individually required charges remain the family's responsibility unless expressly included in writing.

VI. Tuition Assistance and Institutional Awards

AIS-Salzburg may, at its discretion, provide scholarships, tuition assistance, or institutional enrollment grants. Unless expressly stated otherwise, awards apply to tuition only, are valid only for the stated school year, are not automatically renewable, and do not reduce required fees, deposits, incidentals, insurance, examination charges, or individually incurred expenses. Any conditions are stated in the individual award notification. An addendum to the Enrollment Agreement will specify the adjusted tuition terms.

VII. Payment Options

Option	Payment Timing	Additional Charge
A - Full Payment	Tuition, Capital Levy where applicable, and required charges due by August 1, 2027. For students accepted after July 1, payment is due within 30 days of acceptance or before arrival, whichever occurs first.	None
B - Deferred Full Payment	Full annual payment after August 1 but no later than September 1, 2027.	2% of tuition
C - Four Installments	25% upon enrollment/re-enrollment; 25% by September 1, 2027; 25% by December 1, 2027; 25% by February 1, 2028. Prior written agreement required.	4% of published net tuition

All other required charges are payable according to the invoice issued by AIS-Salzburg.

VIII. Sibling Provisions

Sibling Reduction. Families with two or more children simultaneously enrolled may receive a 5% tuition reduction for the youngest enrolled child. The Capital Levy is charged only once per family while siblings are enrolled. School-funded reductions may be combined only to the extent expressly authorized in writing.

IX. Late Enrollment and Late Payments

Students enrolling after the academic year has begun will normally be charged tuition in proportion to the number of school weeks remaining. Any tuition-assistance award will be determined separately. Payment is due within 10 days of receipt of the Enrollment Agreement and invoice unless another arrangement is approved in writing. Payments not received according to the agreed schedule may be subject to a late-payment charge of up to 5% of the overdue amount. AIS-Salzburg may waive or modify the charge where a payment arrangement has been agreed in writing in advance. Substantial or prolonged non-payment may result, to the extent permitted by law, in suspension of services, withholding of official documents, termination of enrollment or residential accommodation, and pursuit of outstanding amounts.

X. Withdrawals and Refunds

If a student voluntarily withdraws after the school year has begun, the family remains responsible for tuition applicable to any trimester already commenced. Tuition attributable to a trimester not yet commenced may be refunded, subject to the Enrollment Agreement. The Application Fee and Capital Levy are non-refundable. Unused Incidentals Account funds are returned after outstanding charges have been settled. If AIS-Salzburg is unable to enroll a student who has otherwise fulfilled the conditions of admission, tuition and refundable fees will be returned in accordance with the Enrollment Agreement and applicable law. If enrollment is terminated for serious disciplinary reasons, refund entitlement is governed by the Enrollment Agreement and applicable law.

XI. Financial Responsibility and Payment

Enrollment constitutes a contractual relationship between AIS-Salzburg and the Student's parents or legal guardians. Parents/guardians remain responsible for all tuition, fees, deposits, incidentals, and other charges regardless of any arrangement with a sponsor, employer, government, agent, or other third party. If documents conflict, the order of precedence stated in the Enrollment Agreement applies. All payments must be made in euros. Bank transfer is preferred. Official banking instructions appear on invoices. Bank charges, transfer costs, currency-conversion charges, and similar expenses are the responsibility of the remitter; AIS-Salzburg must receive the full invoiced amount.

European Union anti money-laundering laws specify that any bank transfers to the school's account must be directly from an account owned by the person or persons invoiced. Cash payments are restricted to 10,000 EUR maximum.
